The rights enumerated include the right to participate in criminal and juvenile justice proceedings, to be notified of major developments in the criminal case, to be notified of changes to the offender's custodial status, to be present at court proceedings and provide input to the prosecutor before a plea agreement is finalized, and to be heard at plea or sentencing proceedings, or any process that may result in the offender's release. CI-116 guarantees crime victims' rights to restitution, privacy, to confer with the prosecuting attorney, and to be informed of their rights. CI-116 defines specific terms and requires no further action by the Legislature for implementation. CI-116, if passed by the electorate, will become effective immediately. I-177 allows the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks to use certain traps on public land when necessary if nonlethal methods have been tried and found ineffective. I-177 allows trapping by public employees and their agents to protect public health and safety, protect livestock and property, or conduct specified scientific and wildlife management activities. I-177, if passed by the electorate, will become effective immediately. I-177 reduces approximately \$61,380 of state funds annually, resulting from a loss of trapping license revenue. The grants, which are funded by state general obligation bonds, can be used to pay the costs of peer-reviewed biomedical research and therapy development, recruiting scientists and students and acquiring innovative technologies at Montana biomedical research organizations. I-181 provides specifics for the Montana Biomedical Research Authority's membership, powers, staffing, grant eligibility and evaluation requirements, and reporting requirements. I-181 authorizes the creation of state bond debts for \$20 million per year for a period of ten years. I-182 allows a single treating physician to certify medical marijuana for a patient diagnosed with chronic pain and includes post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) as a "debilitating medical condition" for which a physician may certify medical marijuana. Licensing requirements, fees and prohibitions are detailed for medical marijuana dispensaries and testing laboratories. I-182 repeals the limit of three patients for each licensed provider, and allows providers to hire employees to cultivate, dispense, and transport medical marijuana. I-182 repeals the requirement that physicians who provide certifications for 25 or more patients annually be referred to the board of medical examiners. Shall the Board of County Commissioners of Gallatin County, Montana (the "County"), be authorized to sell and issue general obligation bonds of the County in one or more series in the aggregate principal amount of up to Sixty-Eight Million Three Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$68,300,000), bearing interest at rates to be determined at the time of the sale, payable semiannually, during a term as to each series of bonds of not more than twenty (20) years, for the purpose of providing funds to pay the costs of designing, constructing, equipping, and furnishing new court and law enforcement facilities in replacement of the existing facilities for use by the County and the City of Bozeman, Montana (the "City") to consist of a new headquarters for County sheriff and City police operations, new courtrooms for the County and City and other offices necessary for the administration of justice and related improvements, and to pay costs associated with the sale and issuance of the bonds?

If this bond proposition and the mill levy proposition of the City presented to City voters simultaneously herewith are passed and the bonds are issued in their full principal amount, County property taxes on a home in the County valued at \$100,000 would increase by approximately \$20.33 per year, on a home in the County valued at \$200,000 would increase by approximately \$40.66 per year, and on a home in the County valued at \$240,000 would increase by approximately \$48.75 per year. If this bond proposition passes and the mill levy proposition of the City fails, the Board of County Commissioners will not proceed with the sale and issuance of the bonds.

Shall the City Commission of the City of Bozeman, Montana (the "City"), be authorized to levy up to 18.21 mills per year for up to 20 years to raise approximately \$1,634,500 per year for the purpose of paying 30.26% of the annual debt service on general obligation bonds of Gallatin County, Montana (the "County") issued to provide funds to pay the costs of designing, constructing, equipping, and furnishing new law and justice facilities for use by the City and County, authorization for which bonds is sought simultaneously with this mill levy election?

If this mill levy proposition is passed, using current assessed values of taxable property in the City, City property taxes on a home in the City valued at \$100,000 would increase by approximately \$24.58 per year, on a home in the City valued at \$200,000 would increase by approximately \$49.16 per year, and on a home in the City valued at \$240,000 (the median home value in the City) would increase by approximately \$58.93 per year. If this mill levy proposition passes and the County bond proposition fails, the City Commission will not proceed with the mill levy.
