Introduction

The Gallatin County Detention Center's top priority is the safety and security of everyone in the facility. For information on an inmate please contact the front desk at 406-582-2130. We are available 7:00 am to 8:00 PM Monday thru Friday, and 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM Saturday (except holidays). On occasion, we are away from the desk, please leave a message and it will be returned promptly.

Funds/Commissary/Phone Calls/Video Visitation

Each inmate has a trust account s/he may use to purchase commissary items or phone minutes. You can put funds on an inmate's account using the kiosk in the lobby or by computer at <https://secure.inmatecanteen.com>. If you have specific questions in regards to the phone system you may contact Telmate at 866-516-0115 or visit the website www.gettingout.com. When an individual leaves the Detention Center s/he will receive a check for the balance of their trust account.

Transports

If your family/friend is to be transported to another county or state, we are unable to discuss any information for safety and security reasons. Thank you for your understanding.

Bond

Bond is the amount the judge sets to guarantee an individual goes to court as required. If you would like to help your family/friend post bond, you can bring in cash, certified check (payable to: Gallatin County Detention Center), or work with a bond company . Bond companies are listed in the phone book or business cards are in the Detention Center lobby.

Medical/Mental Health

Gallatin County Detention Center Medical Clinic (GCDCMC) provides medical care for the Detention Center. Detention Center Staff or GCDCMC may contact you to bring medication for your family/friend. Due to HIPPA regulations, GCDCMC is unable to discuss medical or dental care, medications, or other medical issues. Gallatin Mental Health Services also provides staff at the Detention Center to work with inmates with mental health needs. If you have concerns or information you would like to share, please call our receptionist at 406-582-2130 to be connected with appropriate personnel.

Personal Items

We are unable to accept any items through the front office for inmates other than medications, medical equipment, eyeglasses ,or contact lenses.

Mail

You must put your full name and return address on the envelope. Inmates can only receive letters, cards, and photographs (No Polaroids, newspaper clippings, drawings, stickers, glitter, musical cards, items written in crayon or marker, etc). Please remember, for the safety of staff and inmates, all items are searched before being taken into the Detention Center.

Visiting

Inmate visiting is based on classification and housing assignment. Inmates must be classified as High, Medium, or Low before they are allowed visitation. Individuals in disciplinary segregation are not allowed visitors. Please contact the front office to determine where your family/friend is housed.

Visitation Rules

- To be approved to visit an inmate, a visitor must be 18 years of age or, if under 18, accompanied by an adult (defined as a responsible person who is caring for the child at the present time).
- Visitors 18 and up must bring a government issued photo ID when visiting.
- It is the responsibility of the inmate to notify his visitors when they may visit.
- Visitors must wear modest clothing (e.g., no short skirts, shorts, low cut tops, obscene or vulgar wording). A visitor may be turned away if not appropriately dressed.
- Visitors must leave purses, cell phones, coats and all other personal items in the public lockers provided. If a visitor would like to show an inmate something (ex: pictures, postcards, etc.), they may ask permission from the Reception Desk staff. These items are subject to search.
- Visitors suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will not be allowed to visit.
- Inmates can only have one 30 minutes visit during the allotted visitation time unless approved for a special visit. Starting a second session is against the rules unless a special visit is arranged ahead of time. You must leave immediately after your visitation is over.
